

### 2022/2023 ANNUAL FEE REVIEW



Last week you should have receieved a copy of our 2022/23 annual fee review. Summarised in this letter is the outcome of the fee review, an overview of financial challenges during the last financial year and the resulting necessary fee increase needed to cover operational expenses.

This increase will be introduced in two stages throughout the upcoming financial year.


DAILY RATE	TOTAL PER DAY
CURRENT	\$140
RATE AS OF JULY 11th, 2022	\$150
RATE AS OF JANUARY 1st, 2023	\$155

The increase ensures we can cover growing service expenses and are able to increase staff wages. This enables us to continue attracting and retaining the high-quality educators we have at Subicare in this current tight market.

Currently all families pay fees via Debit Success, you do not need to take any action, payments will be adjusted to reflect these changes

If children who are unwell are brought in to the service, it is extremely difficult to break the chain of infection as they then spread their germs to other children, families and staff.


We understand it can be difficult to take time off from work to care for your sick child, but we need your help to keep our community safe.

#### **HELPFUL TIPS**


- Wash your hands thouroughly with soap often
